Their presentation, “*Advanced Professionalism*,” will include – and go beyond – ethics, to encompass how professionalism promotes you, your case, and your profession. They will address professionalism in writing, in court, in depositions, and in other specific situations. They will address strategies when confronted with practitioners who are not conducting themselves well. Judge Acosta and Justice Flynn practiced law before their appointments to the federal and state bench; their presentation arises from experience as practitioners and as judges.

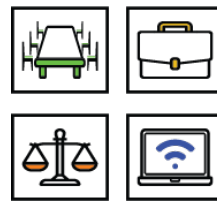

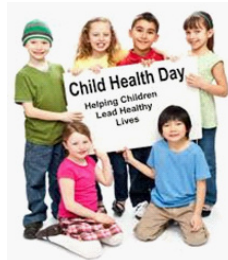

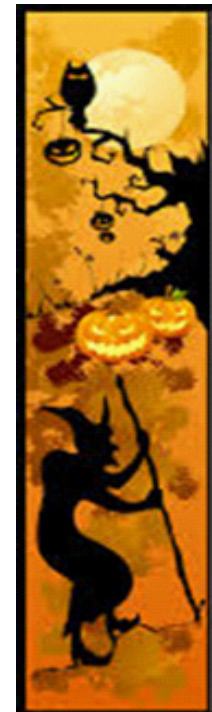
